Revisiting the University instrument used to measure Teacher effectiveness adaptive to the trends of the new normal, three faculty members in the campus –Dr. Ma. Angelita S. Rabanal, Dr. Billy S. Javier and Arlene D. Talosa joined the Technical Working Group with Vice President for Academic Affairs, Dr. Mariden V. Cauilan, Dr. Lirio Mangaul, University Director for Instruction and Dr. Gigid Battung, the Director for Distance Education and Rio Averil Pamitan, Quality Assurance Staff and faculty of the CSU-Carig Campus.

The team as completers of the joint four module distance learning course of the University of the Philippines Open University in partnership with the Commission on Higher Education on flexible learning delivery transition to the new normal of education ensured the incorporation of indicators to learning deliveries in the virtual environment regardless of the platforms and modalities utilized, either synchronous and asynchronous.

Parameters along commitment, teaching

for independent learning, management for learning were maintained as said themes were the same themes present in the Common Criteria Evaluation of the NBC evaluation tool. National Budget Circular (NBC 461) sets the latest guidelines in the promotion and standardization of salary of faculty and administrators at the SUCs and CHED – Supervised institutions including TESDA (PADA 1998).

To ensure the validity of the instrument, the crafted instrument will also be sent for content and form validation to the directors of the University of the Philippines Open University. UPOU is a pioneer in online teaching and learning which continues to play a leading role in the study and practice of distance education in the Philippines.

Further, as part of its validation as per announcement from the VP Acad, said instrument will also be presented to students and student organization advisers this February 26, 2021 via zoom.

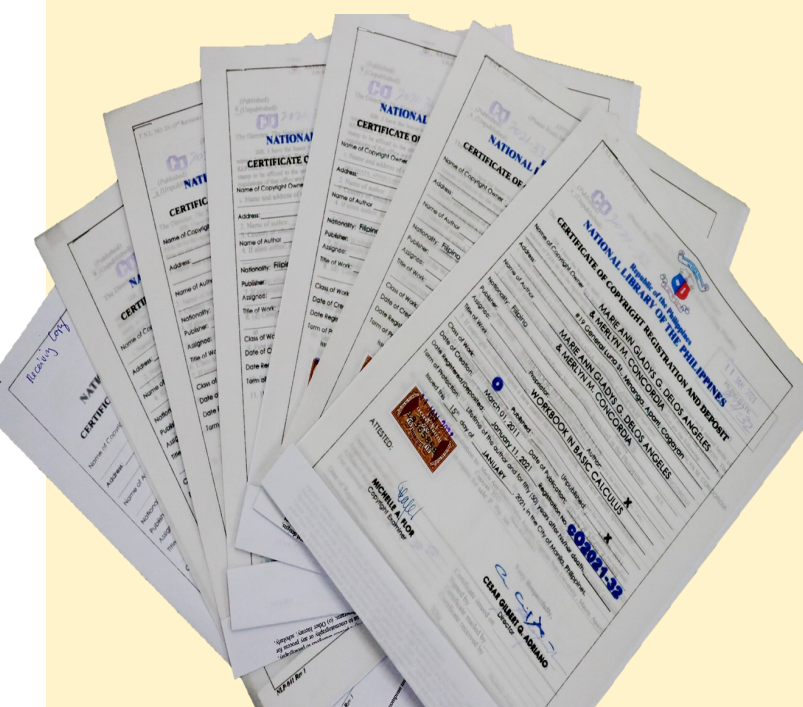
KTM Office registers faculty creative outputs

With strong commitment to support educators in developing the skills to effectively capitalize on their potential and prepare their students to be lifelong online learners in the CSU – Learning Environment Network Systems (SU-LENS) for the coming semester, Dr. Gigid Battung, the University Director for Distance Learning and e-Learning Resource Center engaged the whole pool of faculty of instruction of Cagayan State University Aparri and capacitated them on the University-wide Webinar on Interactive Module Development for Outcomes-Based Education Training on February 02, 2021 via zoom platform.

Said training aimed to enhance teachers competencies in Interactive modules development which can include features such as animations, gamification, interactive elements such as audio, video, text and graphics. These modules could provide learners immersive experience and great control over learning and the learning environment online. Interactive in its approach, Dr. Battung added gamified twists in her virtual presentation through drag and drop, interactive video and interactive presentation for H5P interactive ac-

tivity features of the LENS. Dr. Battung said that customizing the feature, learners would become active participants in the knowledge gaining process rather than passive absorbers of information.

“This is our commitment in making our online learning modules more engaging for our 24,000+ students who are facing the challenges of Pandemic. Training our more than 600 faculty members via Zoom to acquire online teaching skills definitely was an enormous task that I felt I could have not done without the mission in my heart pushing me to go beyond myself to give back the glory to God. I know I am just an instrument.” says Dr. Battung.

Having learned new knowledge on developing and designing interactive courses, the LENS Manager, Dr. Billy S. Javier highly hopes that the knowledge acquired will be turned into palpable practice this second semester most specially that the Commission on Higher Education may do random observation of our online classes for monitoring. In an effort to contribute to the growing body of knowledge, the research outputs of the faculty members from the College of Criminal Justice Education - CSU Aparri made a milestone as 2 of their research papers were published in the International Journal of Advanced Research in Management and Social Sciences (ISSN: 2278-6236 Vol 10 Issue 2) in February 2021.

The article titled, "Extent of the Implementation of the Fire Prevention Programs of the Bureau of Fire Protection Aparri Fire Station", disclosed the relevant factors and extent of implementation of the fire prevention programs of the Bureau of Fire Protection - Aparri Fire Station. In consonance to the Fire Prevention Month, this timely article, authored by Mr. Oliver G. Ferrer, communicated the best practices and challenges impeding the implementation of various

fire prevention programs.

Meanwhile, the paper authored by the team of Mrs. Hermilinda P. Orenze, Mr. Oliver G. Ferrer, and Dr. Jennifer Coballes, highlighted the performances of barangay peacekeeping action teams, as well as significant factors influencing the extent of implementation of the duties and responsibilities of BPATs in Buguey Cagayan.

The paper titled, "Performance of Barangay Peacekeeping Action Teams of Buguey Cagayan" also emphasized the roles of the BPATs and barangay officials in disaster risk reduction management. Both papers, institutionally-funded research outputs completed in 2019 and 2020, were CCJEs' research and development efforts aligned to the college research priorities and the Campus/University thrusts. When a missing person was recorded, Prof. Tanny Ignacio and Dr. Lito did the rescue operation. Simulating the event, Dr. Ma. Angelita S. Rabanal and Ms. Richelle Paliuanan, both registered nurses step in for first-aid measures.

The event was graced by Edmar Danao, a registered professional rescuer of the Provincial Task force Lingkod Bayan, as an external validator who commended the participation and readiness to respond of the employees.

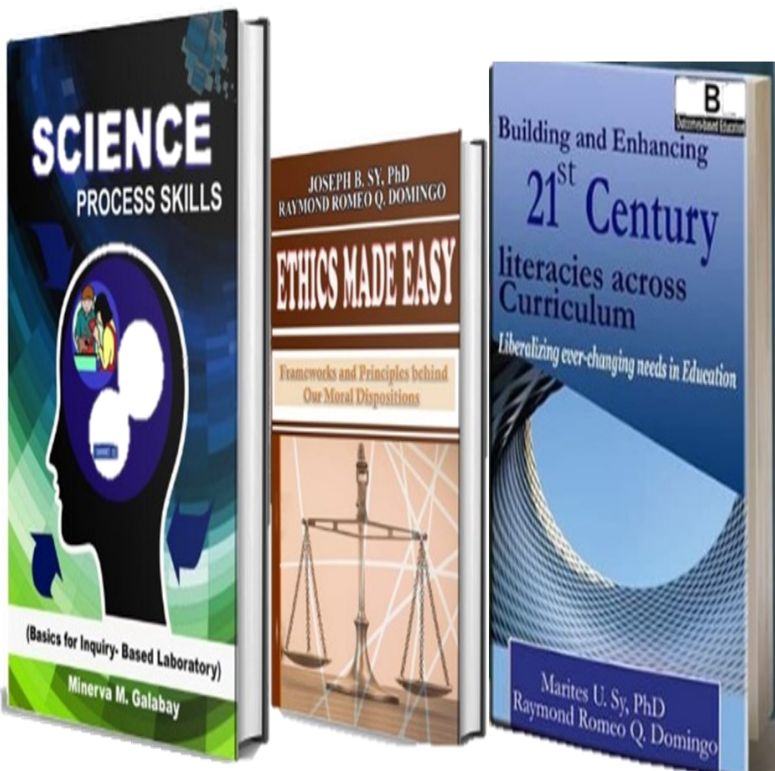

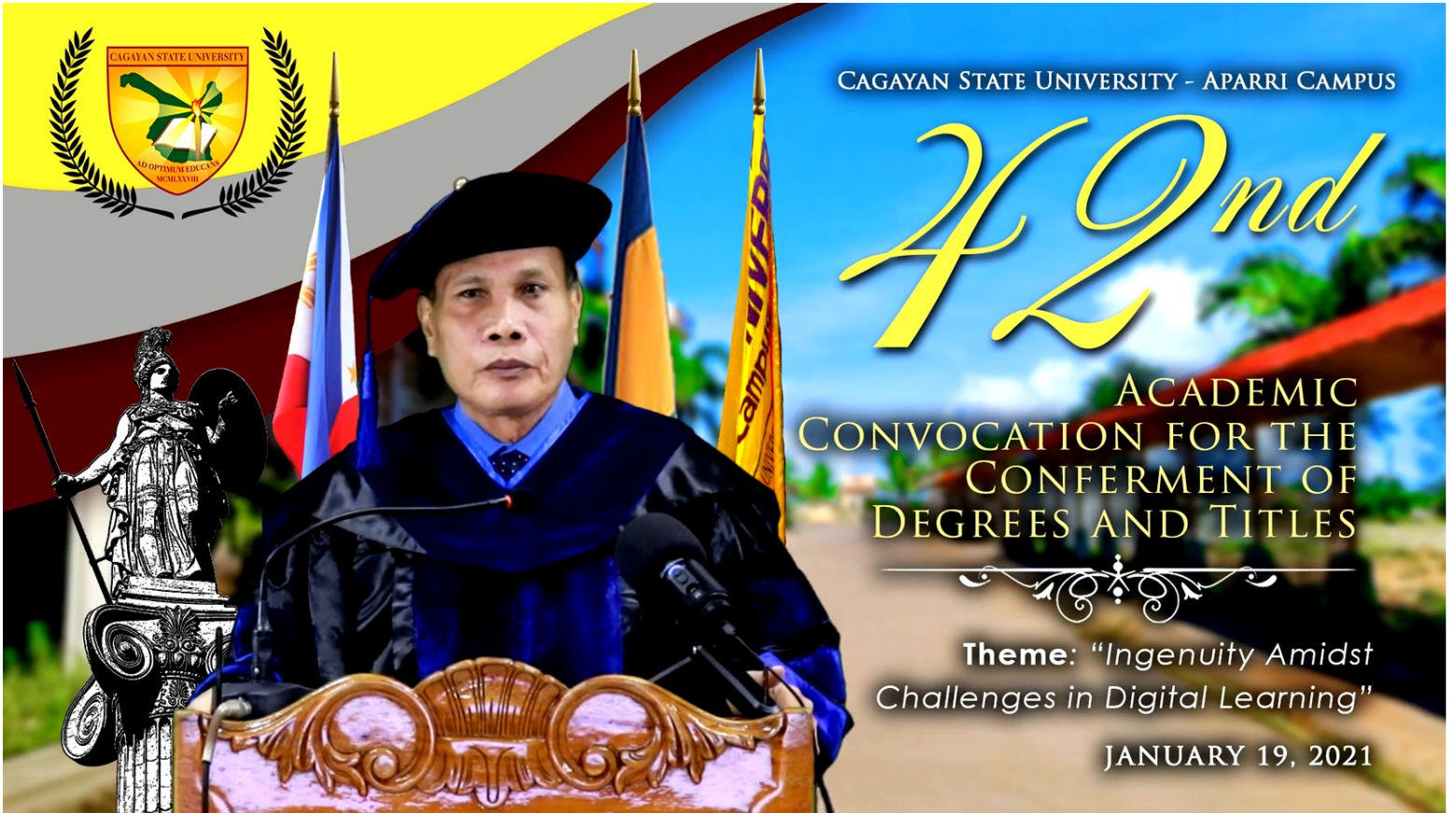
Ground breaking ceremony signals new building to rise at Aparri

BS in Fisheries for School year 2019 2020 and 22 graduates (2, PhD in Education, 3 MA in Educational Management, 1 MA in Education major in English, 5 MS in Information Technology, 1 MS Teaching Mathematics, 7 BS in Information Technology and 4 BS in Hospitality Industry Management totaling to 22) for the school year 2020-2021 first semester, the campus sent off 182 competent and well-equipped graduates who are ready to take off holding the hallmark of excellence the campus has equipped them with.
