Badajos coached the office process owners of Cagayan State University at Aparri Campus on Risk based thinking and Document Control on July 19, 2022.

Ronald Bautista, the university Risk-based Thinking officer creatively called the attention of the process owners by his game-based following-direction-activity in introducing risk and opportunities. He oriented the offices on the importance of risk and opportunities as contributing factors in the effectiveness of quality management system especially in the achievement of improved results and spontaneous realization of the organizations strategic and operational objectives.

"In the context of organization, there are challenges of changing conditions and situations from outside (external issues) and also within (Internal Issues). As we bring our existing QMS up to speed, we need to capture internal and external risk issues and apply risk based thinking to ensure risks are addressed, and reduced or eliminated RBT leads us in determining what more is needed to improve our own processes in continuity"

Meanwhile Jon Paul T. Badajos and Shelley Tungcol explained on the ten clause structures of the ISO 9001: 2015. The two highlighted that ISO 9001:2015 moves risk based thinking from a "should" or a good idea to enhance a QMS to a "shall" requirement

Embracing the risk as an integral component of the process, the trio coached the process owners in filling out the forms in congruence to their audit reports.

The set campus threshold for Masters program in the graduate school is 28 percent originality index while 25 percent is the set threshold for Doctoral programs.


In the message of Director Julius Capili, he emphasized about the virtue of Research dynamism and research humility according word of praise to the campus in its research efforts.
